## Usefullnformation

- When I circle the very top of the behavior log, this means your child when "off the charts" on that day. When a student does that, they get to move their clothespin to my lanyard and receive a special prize at the end of the day.
- Thank you so much for reading with your child! Remember, mark the books on the back of the behaviorlogs and send the book back to school each day. If your child continues to take the same book home each evening, please let me know.
- Homework: Ideally, your child will need to complete a math worksheet, listen to someone read to him/her (this will transition to the student reading later), and do the practice piece on the reading log side (chant $A B C$ chart, Popcorn Word practice, counting, or Letter Recognition practice). Please know that |know Kindergarten students will not be able to complete homework each evening. Remember, if there is a time when your child did not get a chance to complete his her homework. Just keep it for the next evening and turn it in the next day. I will NOT send homework home on Friday. The reading $\log$ and "free choice" next to the reading log, will be completely up to you.
- Rest time will remain until January. Your child is welcome to bring in a stuffed animal or small blanket to help them get comfortable during rest time.
